The Council on Accreditation for Two-Year Colleges (CATYC) was established in 1937. The purposes of the organization include working with The Higher Learning Commission (HLC) in the promotion of standards, practices, and policies of two-year colleges, communication with other educational agencies, advocating for two-year colleges related to accreditation, and also, providing relevant professional development opportunities to assure our member colleges are up-to-date on current trends, policies, and best practices in higher education.

The Fall 2021 CATYC Conference will be held September 12-14, 2021, in Kansas City, MO. The theme of our conference is "Innovation in the Heartland."
